





Walsh School for Performing and Visual Arts.

Dan Sullivan, Jr., the current Executive Chairman of Collette, a company we are proud to have in Pawtucket, exemplifies civic leadership. After becoming CEO in 1990, Dan transformed the travel industry through innovation and collaboration. Beyond his business acumen, Dan is an exceptional community partner, investing in the community and advocating for economic development.

Lifelong educator and visionary business leader Donald L. Stafford has devoted himself to advancing technology in education. As a two-time graduate of Brown University, Donald has championed expanded access to STEM education for at-risk youth. He serves as a shining example of what can be achieved when one uses their talent to uplift their community.

Renowned throughout the state for "Bob's Big Adventures," Pawtucket native Robert "Bob" Venturini serves as a fantastic ambassador for both our city and state. With over three decades of experience in local broadcasting, Bob has highlighted the beauty and uniqueness of Rhode Island. He is also dedicated to community service, supporting various local non-profits with his time and talents.

The late Gretchen Dow Simpson is celebrated for her extensive contributions to the arts and culture landscape in Pawtucket. Her work earned national recognition, appearing on the cover of the New Yorker magazine 58 times. Despite her national accomplishments, she was always willing to lend her support to Pawtucket community projects, and she is especially well-known for her iconic I-95 mural, commissioned as part of Governor Lincoln Chafee's Highways Beautification Project. Her artwork showcases the best of Pawtucket and continues to inspire artists across our state with its timeless quality.

Historical inductee James C. Potter was an inventor, engineer, and civic leader. After emigrating from Scotland to the United States, he founded a textile company in Pawtucket that employed 1,000 workers. James was a consummate inventor, creating products that played a significant role in defining Pawtucket's industrial growth. He was also dedicated to public service, helping to develop Slater Park into the largest green space in our city, which we all enjoy today.

Our 2025 Person of the Year is Dr. Rosemary Costigan, president of the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI). A proud graduate of Pawtucket West High School, Rosemary uses her personal and professional experiences to inspire greatness in others. As the first alumna to become president of the institution, Rosemary has guided CCRI to achieve a 10-year reaccreditation from the New England Commission of Higher Education. She has been recognized for her excellence in educational leadership and her commitment to community prosperity.

Tonight we celebrate the induction of 6 new members into the 2025 Pawtucket Hall of Fame as well as recognizing a person the Pawtucket Hall of Fame committee has selected to receive this year's "Person of the Year Award". The Pawtucket Hall of Fame has been well served over the years by a volunteer committee of local community members who have dedicated their time and energy to organize this annual event, now in its 33rd year. The Pawtucket Hall of Fame awards first took place in 1986 as part of the Centennial Celebration event created by (then) Mayor Henry Kinch, as a fitting way to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Pawtucket as a city. During that event, 25 people were selected that evening and honored for their contributions that had instilled a sense of pride in the community. These honorees were praised as local heroes, for they were educators, industrialists, business people, sports figures, Olympic gold medal winners, poets, television personalities and producers - all people we could proudly call our own. Their names have been honorably and proudly placed in the lobby of Pawtucket City Hall for all visitors to see. And while 25 people were recognized for that one night in 1986, as the years went by there were others that followed, certainly worthy to receive this honor. In 1992 under the direction and charge of the late Raymond Dalton, Sr., Pawtucket Hall of Fame was 'resurrected' and became an annual celebration worthy to stand on its own. It would recognize those special individuals 'whose contributions in any line of endeavor had added to the heritage of the City of Pawtucket. This year's class of inductees have rightfully satisfied this requirement in their own respective ways. As a group, their life experiences are diverse, but each share the threat of passion and selfless determination to make a difference in their community. This year we present you with a group of people who have left their mark in a variety of ways while 'shining a positive light' on our city. We present you with this year's 2025 Pawtucket Hall of Fame inductees: Daniel J. Sullivan, Jr., a visionary business leader, respected philanthropist, and dedicated community advocate. The late Gretchen Dow Simpson, acclaimed Rhode Island painter internationally recognized for her minimalist architectural imagery. Donald L. 2025 Person of the Year Dr. Rosemary A. Costigan



The Pawtucket Hall of Fame Committee is proud to honor Dr. Rosemary Costigan as its 2025 Person of the Year. Established in 2014, this award is distinct from induction into the Hall of Fame and is presented annually to an individual who has made outstanding contributions to Pawtucket over the past year.

A lifelong Pawtucket resident, Dr. Costigan graduated from Pawtucket West High School (now Shea High School). She earned an associate degree in nursing from the Community College of Rhode Island (then Rhode Island Junior College), becoming the first CCRI alumna to be named president of the institution. Her education remained rooted in Rhode Island. After CCRI, she earned a bachelor's degree in nursing from Rhode Island College and both a master's and Ph.D. in nursing from the University of Rhode Island. On June 18, 2025, the Rhode Island Council on Postsecondary Education voted unanimously to appoint her CCRI's sixth president. She is also only the second woman to hold this role in the college's history.

Dr. Costigan began her career at CCRI as a nursing faculty member, teaching and mentoring students for more than 15 years before serving as Department Chair. She later became Assistant Dean of Nursing Education and Vice President for Academic Affairs (VPAA). As VPAA, she launched the college's first Academic Master Plan, expanded online learning, promoted faculty development, and implemented Guided Pathways to help students graduate.

Appointed Interim President in September 2023, Dr. Costigan quickly proved her ability to lead Rhode Island's largest public institution of higher education. Under her leadership, CCRI achieved a 10-year reaccreditation from the New England Commission of Higher Education, joined the Achieving the Dream network to strengthen equity and outcomes, and secured the largest private donation in its history—a \$2 million gift to redesign developmental education. She also introduced accelerated terms, expanded early college access, and advanced new work-based learning initiatives.

As a first-generation college graduate, Dr. Costigan's rise to CCRI's highest office embodies the opportunity and upward mobility that Pawtucket public schools and CCRI have long provided. Her story is a triumph and an inspiration to the students she now leads. Beyond CCRI, she serves on the Board of Trustees for Davies Career & Technical High School and has worked as a peer evaluator for NECHE and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing.

Her accomplishments have been widely recognized. She was inducted into the CCRI Society of Knights in 2016, named one of Providence Business News' Business Women of the Year in 2024, and received the Rosemary Wood Nursing Leadership Award and the Academic Excellence Award from the Hospital Association of Rhode Island.

A mother of five and grandmother of eight, Dr. Costigan continues to call Pawtucket her home. Her journey—from Shea High School student to CCRI alumna to sixth president of the Community College of Rhode Island—makes her a role model for Pawtucket's young people and a most deserving recipient of the 2025 Person of the Year Award.

2025 Historical Inductee James C. Potter (1855-1925)



The Pawtucket Hall of Fame proudly honors James Charles Potter, an engineer, inventor, industrialist, and civic leader whose vision and achievements helped define Pawtucket's industrial rise in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Born in Glasgow, Scotland, on May 1, 1855, Potter was educated at the Mechanics' Institutes and gained early experience as an engineer with H.J.H. King & Company, the Anchor Line Steamship Company, and the Vale of Clyde Engineering Works. He also served in the 5th Battalion of the Royal Rifles. In 1874, he emigrated to the United States to join his father in Lowell, Massachusetts, where he worked for the Whitehead & Atherton Machine Company. Over 13 years, he advanced from designer to manager, gaining the expertise that would later shape his career in Pawtucket.

In 1887, Potter moved to Pawtucket and co-founded the Potter & Atherton Machine Company. Starting with 20 employees, the firm expanded to 250 within six years. In 1893, he organized the Howard & Bullough American Machine Company, which employed more than 1,000 workers producing textile machinery. Later, with John Johnston, he established the Potter & Johnston Machine Company, incorporated in 1899. Occupying a sprawling plant on Newport Avenue, the company specialized in advanced automatic turning and chucking machines and exported worldwide, employing more than 350 people at its height.

Potter was also a prolific inventor. He received patents for a stripping mechanism for carding machines (1885), a turret lathe (1905), and an automatic turret lathe (1919). These innovations contributed to Pawtucket's reputation as a hub of industrial ingenuity.

Equally dedicated to public service, Potter became chairman of the Pawtucket Park Commission in 1917, shaping the growth of Slater Park, the city's largest green space. That year, he donated the Potter Casino, a two-story recreational facility that served canoeists, skaters, and visitors, with an upstairs rest hall for community use. The building became a beloved feature of the park and remains one of his most visible civic gifts. His name also endures through the Potter-Burns Elementary School, formerly J.C. Potter Elementary, and other notable buildings along Newport Avenue.

Potter's personal life was marked by devotion to family. In 1879, he married Charlotte Holland in Baltimore, Maryland. The couple had six children: Wallace and Clara, born in Lowell; and Charlotte, Elizabeth, James, and Mary, born in Pawtucket. Remembered for his energy, intellect, and steady leadership, Potter exemplified both his Scottish heritage and the industrious spirit of his adopted city.

James C. Potter passed away on October 30, 1925, leaving behind a legacy of innovation, civic generosity, and community building. The companies he founded sustained Pawtucket's economy for decades, and the Potter & Johnston plant later became the headquarters of Hasbro Industries, linking his contributions to both the city's industrial and cultural life.

A builder, inventor, and civic-minded leader, James C. Potter helped shape modern Pawtucket. His legacy endures in its schools, parks, industries, and institutions, making him a most deserving inductee into the Pawtucket Hall of Fame.



2025 Posthumous Inductee Gretchen Dow Simpson



It is with great pleasure that we honor the late Gretchen Dow Simpson in her induction into the Pawtucket Hall of Fame — a fitting tribute to a remarkable artist, mentor, and creative force whose presence here in Rhode Island enriched our cultural landscape.

Gretchen was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts in 1939 and earned her artistic foundation at the Rhode Island School of Design. Early in her career she embraced photography and design before discovering the painter's journey she would fully inhabit.

Her work first gained wider recognition when she began creating covers for The New Yorker—over the course of 21 years she produced 58 covers, bringing her clean-lined, light-filled vision of New England architecture into millions of homes. Her paintings are at once reverent and spare — saluting the clapboard houses, stairwells, and spacious interiors of the region with a "photographer's eye," as she described it.

In 1993, Gretchen joined the iconic —Absolut ad campaign with "Absolut Dow Simpson," a playful yet polished piece that brought her distinctive aesthetic to a new audience. It was a reminder that her work could bridge fine art and popular culture without losing its elegant identity.

Perhaps most meaningful to this community is the fact that Gretchen made her studio in the City of Pawtucket—first at 453 Cottage Street for several years – and then purchasing 75 Montgomery Street with friend and colleague Mimo Gordon Riley. It was a memorable experience for some of our Pawtucket children when Gretchen, Mimo and Marianne Purviance worked with Don Chabot and the students from the Curvin McCabe School for several weeks creating a beautiful mural in the school. The ending treat was to have these same students visit the artists' studios located across the street from the school and the students got to learn about who these artists were that had been giving them instruction. In 2012 she extended her artistic vision into the public realm with a striking 1,400-square-foot mural along I-95 in Pawtucket: six windows painted in her signature style, transforming an ordinary overpass into a portal of light and geometry.

Beyond her output, Gretchen was a generous presence — mentor, board member, and supporter of Rhode Island's arts institutions. Her calm precision in painting belied a vivacious spirit: she loved dancing, travel, and finding connections between architecture and the deeply human stories those structures hold. Today her painting "Hope" acquired through the Pawtucket Arts Festival in 2004 can be found in the Mayor's reception area of Pawtucket City Hall.

We celebrate not just her body of work, but her commitment to the region that helped shape her—and that she helped shape in return. Gretchen's art had clarity, stillness, and light; her legacy has community, inspiration, and place, and the impact she had in Pawtucket will always remain "Absolut Dow Simpson". We proudly welcome Gretchen into this year's Pawtucket Hall of Fame.



2025 Posthumous Inductee Jacqueline M. Walsh



Jacqueline M. Walsh was a visionary educator, passionate arts advocate, and beloved community leader whose legacy continues to shine brightly in Pawtucket and beyond. As the namesake of the Jacqueline M. Walsh School for the Performing and Visual Arts, she championed a bold idea: that every student deserves a space to explore their creativity, cultivate their talents, and be seen for who they truly are.

Born in Pawtucket on September 25 to Hazel and Joe Walsh, Jacqueline—affectionately known as "Jackie" to friends and colleagues—was deeply rooted in the community she would dedicate her life to serving. She attended St. Leo's School and graduated from Sacred Heart Academy before pursuing higher education. Walsh earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Master's Degree in Education from Rhode Island College, later completing a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Connecticut. This strong academic foundation prepared her to lead with vision and purpose.

Walsh began her professional career in 1969 as a classroom teacher in the Pawtucket School Department. Over the course of 32 years, she steadily rose through the ranks—serving as an enrichment teacher, principal, Director of Elementary Education, Assistant Superintendent, and ultimately Deputy Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment. In every role, she championed excellence in teaching, strengthened curriculum development, and inspired innovation in both elementary and secondary education.

Her tireless service was formally recognized in 2001 when the Rhode Island Senate passed a joint resolution honoring her 32 years of dedication to the children of Pawtucket. Colleagues remember her as a tireless advocate for students, a thoughtful mentor to teachers, and a leader whose intelligence and compassion instilled confidence throughout the district.

Even after retiring from the Pawtucket schools, Dr. Walsh's passion for education did not wane. She continued her influence as an assistant professor at Providence College, where she mentored aspiring teachers and instilled in them both professional skill and a deep commitment to public service. Her legacy extended well beyond the classroom, shaping the next generation of educators.

Perhaps the most enduring tribute to her life's work is the Jacqueline M. Walsh School for the Performing and Visual Arts, an audition-based public high school in Pawtucket named in her honor. Dedicated to nurturing young talent, the school embodies Walsh's lifelong belief in the power of enrichment programs to inspire students and unlock their potential. Her name, and the values she stood for, will live on in every student who passes through its doors.

Outside of her professional life, Jackie was a vibrant and multifaceted individual. She enjoyed playing tennis, cheering on the Boston Red Sox, and making trips to Newport's International Tennis Hall of Fame. She was also devoted to her beloved dog, Pebbles. Friends and family remember her warm humor, loyalty, and the joy she found in simple pleasures. She will forever be remembered not only for what she accomplished—but for how she made people feel: seen, heard, and inspired. We are proud to induct Jacqueline M. Walsh into this year's Pawtucket Hall of Fame.



2025 Inductee Donald L. Stanford



Donald L. Stanford has built an extraordinary career marked by innovation, leadership, and community commitment—all while remaining deeply rooted in his hometown of Pawtucket. His professional accomplishments and personal integrity reflect the very best of what this city represents.

A graduate of Brown University, Mr. Stanford earned his Bachelor of Arts in International Relations in 1972 and his master's degree in computer science and applied mathematics in 1977. In 1979, he joined the founding team of GTECH Corporation (now IGT Global Solutions) as Manager of Software Development. Over the next three decades, he played a central role in transforming the small Rhode Island startup into a global leader in lottery and gaming systems, serving as Vice President of Advanced Development and later as Chief Technology Officer. 2025 Inductee Robert P. "Bob" Venturini



Robert P. "Bob" Venturini has long been one of Pawtucket's most familiar voices and most generous community supporters. A lifelong Rhode Islander, Bob grew up with a passion for storytelling, connecting with his neighbors, and shining a spotlight on our state's unique character. Tonight we recognize his decades of service in media, mentorship, nonprofit support and civic life.

From the earliest days of his career, Bob understood that broadcasting was about more than just speaking into a microphone — it was about giving people a voice. Over a span of more than thirty years he created and hosted programs such as An Hour with Bob and Bob's Big Adventures, producing well over 2,000 episodes that dove into Rhode Island's talent, culture and character. In each segment he invited locals to share their stories, turning ordinary folks into on-air stars and reminding us how rich our community is.

Bob's involvement in Pawtucket goes well beyond the studio. He has coached Little League teams, volunteered for holiday telethons that distributed more than 300,000 toys to children in need, and lent his time and energy to countless nonprofits. One neighbor remembers Bob standing in the bleachers at a weekend game, stopping mid-play to congratulate a youngster on a great hit — not because it was required, but because he simply cared.

In his role as mentor, Bob opened doors for young media professionals — offering a first job, sharing a tip, or simply giving encouragement to someone who dared to pick up a camera. He frequently remarked that if one of his guests inspired just one viewer to tell their own story, then the work was worth it. Once, at a holiday charity event, Bob donned a Santa hat and handed out toys himself, taking the time to ask each child their name, their favorite color, and what they hoped for in the coming year. That moment — personal, unassuming, warm — captured everything people love about him.

For Bob, Pawtucket is home: the place where he raised his family, built his career, and invested his time. Whether walking Main Street, chatting with shop owners or stopping by the local coffee shop, he's always been visible and genuine. His passion for revitalizing the area along the Blackstone River and helping boost the city's profile has helped reinforce the pride so many of us feel for this place.

Today we honor Bob not just for what he's done — though the list is long — but for who he is: a storyteller, a cheerleader for others, a citizen who believes that a stronger community starts with one neighbor helping the next. How to Nominate a Person to the Pawtucket Hall of Fame

The Pawtucket Hall of Fame Committee was established in 1986 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Pawtucket as a city. The purpose of the Pawtucket Hall of Fame is to honor the contributions of those individuals whose efforts - in any line of endeavor - have added to the heritage of the City of Pawtucket.

Eligibility to the Hall of Fame

Nominees do not have to be native born to Pawtucket but must have had some significant impact on the city as a whole. This award is given to those selected nominees who have gone 'above & beyond' in their community service activities and/or who have been vehicles that shine a positive light upon the city.

A person is eligible for election to the City of Pawtucket Hall of Fame if that person meets any or all of the following criteria:

- Born in the City of Pawtucket
- Whose reputation was made while a resident of the City of Pawtucket
- Who has made the City of Pawtucket the home of their business AND
- Who has made a lasting impact on the quality of life of the citizens of the City of Pawtucket.

To Nominate a person to the Pawtucket Hall of Fame:

A Pawtucket Hall of Fame nomination form, which can be found on the Pawtucket Hall of Fame website: www.pawtuckethalloffame.org, and a letter of nomination must be sent to the Chairperson listing the nominee's name, and should include a statement explaining why this person is being nominated. A minimum of two additional letters of support from other individuals will be required to accept this nomination. These letters of support or any other materials that will support this nomination may be mailed separately, but must be received by the deadline to be included in the nomination submission.

When the committee meets to review and consider candidates, the person who made the initial nomination will be allowed to come before the committee to speak and answer any questions the Pawtucket Hall of Fame Committee may have.

Deadline for Nomination: Friday, May 15, 2026

The Pawtucket Hall of Fame is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization established in 1986 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Pawtucket as a City. The purpose of the Pawtucket Hall of Fame is to honor the contributions of those individuals whose efforts have added to the heritage of the City of Pawtucket.
